Seven deaths, 412 fresh Covid-19 patients in U'khand

The forward march of the novel Coronavirus (Covid-19) contagion in Uttarakhand is continuing without any hindrance. The state health department reported seven deaths and 412 new patients of the disease on Monday that increased the tally of the patients of the disease to 15529.

117 fresh cases reported in Chd, total tally crosses 3000-mark

The COVID-19 cases crossed 3000-mark in the union territory of Chandigarh with 117 fresh infections reported on Monday. The total tally stood at 3035 including 1350 active cases till the evening.

Amidst a rising number of A cases across Punjab and also in Mohali district, the private hospitals have agreed to extend the medical care to the COVID-19 patients in home isolation.

tion. "But people have apprehensions about home isolation and insist upon hospitalization. This, in turn, puts unnecessary pressure on beds meant for critical patients," said the Deputy Commissioner adding that with exponential rise in COVID-19 cases, "rolling out the home care packages will help reduce avoidable overcrowding at hospitals".

extending this service, said Dayalan. Broadly, the home care would involve patients under home isolation to be monitored remotely by the concerned hospital. Patients would get to talk to the doctors on video chat and nurses and paramedics would also be available for video consultation to ensure constant monitoring.

desirous of additional consultancy for self-reassurance, they may have the option open to them," said Deputy Commissioner. The hospitals informed that different types of home care packages like a basic package entailing services like daily monitoring of the vitals by a trained nurse twice a day, a tele-review with a doctor every third day as well as a medical kit (with a thermometer and an oxygen saturation metre) and an advanced more thorough 'complete COVID care' package including the COVID-19 test; N-95 and other masks, gloves, sanitizers, a pulse oximeter, a digital thermometer, a blood pressure machine, a PPE kit, as well as vitals monitoring tools.
